SUMMER SCHOOL 2020

Remedial courses 9-12 are available in Core subjects. Students must have 35%-49% , have regular attendance and write final examination/summative evaluation. Information and course offerings are usually available by the end of April. The website for summer school is www.creditprograms.ca.

ELEARNING 2020

Full credit courses are available through Elearning in July & August, as well as throughout the school year. Students may only enroll in one course, at a time, and must have approval of their guidance counsellor. Information and course offerings are usually available by the end of April.

DUAL CREDITS 2020

Dual credits are an opportunity for students to take a college credit course while still being a high school student. Students will earn both a college and a high school credit and will attend the college for a half day each week.
